

Sellersville Group

The Sellersville Group meeting is the oldest in District 47 starting sometime in 1949. This group is probably one of the oldest Pennsylvania groups outside of Philadelphia and Allentown. Unfortunately the District and the Area Archives do not have a written history of the group.

Back in 1996/97 the Sellersville group had to clean out its storage area because of leakage problems and discovered AA literature from the 1950's. All items were donated to the Area Archives and some items can be seen at Area functions.
